



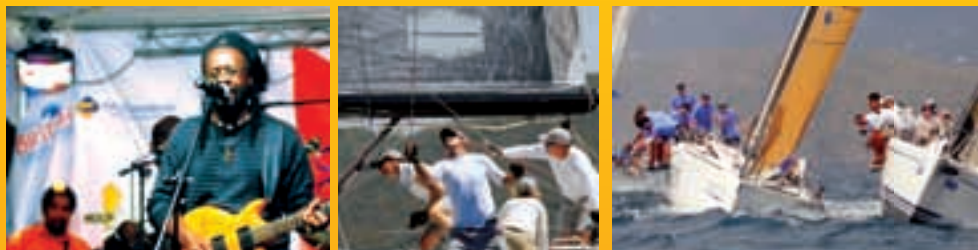

Norman Island Course Area

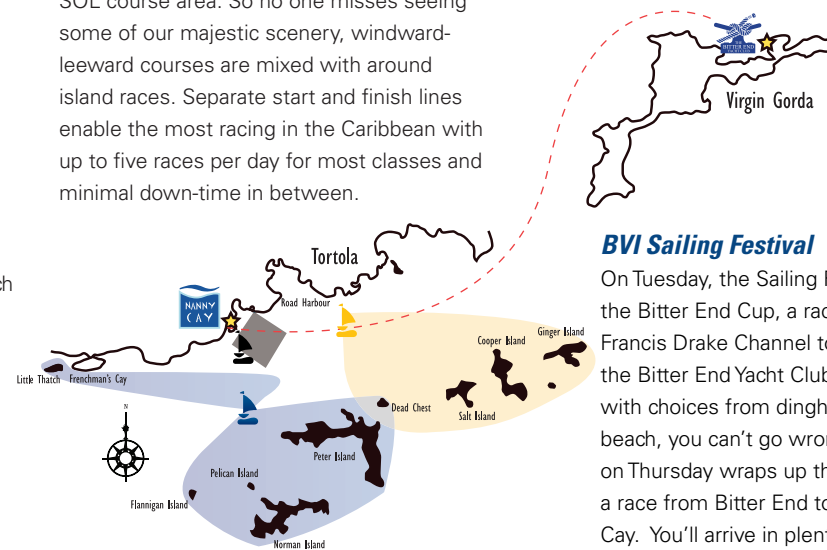
Just to the west, for those who would rather race around islands than buoys, and want the choice of spinnaker or not, there is the Norman course area. This is the area that offers competitors more options and the opportunity to take the "scenic route". 2010 introduces the International Yacht Club Challenge to the Norman Course.

LIME One Design Area

The LIME One Design hosts the lasers, beach cats and IC24's. Spectators on the beach at Nanny Cay will feel like they are in on the action with the most competitive sailing taking place close to shore. The windward leeward courses provide tight racing with on the water umpiring ensuring fair play.

SOL Course Area

Racing and Racer/Cruiser divisions sail in the SOL course area. So no one misses seeing some of our majestic scenery, windward-leeward courses are mixed with around island races. Separate start and finish lines enable the most racing in the Caribbean with up to five races per day for most classes and minimal down-time in between.



BVI Sailing Festival

On Tuesday, the Sailing Festival begins with the Bitter End Cup, a race up the scenic Sir Francis Drake Channel to a sailors' paradise, the Bitter End Yacht Club. Lay Day follows and with choices from dinghy racing to limin' on the beach, you can't go wrong. The Nanny Cay Cup on Thursday wraps up the Sailing Festival with a race from Bitter End to event host, Nanny Cay. You'll arrive in plenty of time for BVI Spring Regatta registration and the opening party.
